"I was an unexposed kid with no sense of direction when I first came to Austin from Caldwell, Texas. After spending four years under Coach Royal's capable wings, I left the University of Texas a more grounded and purpose-driven young man," said Alfred Jackson, UT football alumni and 7 season NFL wide receiver with Atlanta Falcons.

"My grandmother died of Alzheimer's, so I know firsthand the devastation the disease can have on a family. It is my hope that my association with the Darrell K Royal Research Fund for Alzheimer's disease will help bring more educational awareness to a disease in desperate need of a cure," Jackson said.

In her testimony before the Special Interim Joint Committee on Alzheimer's Disease Mrs. Royal said, "This private fund to advance Alzheimer's research in Texas is an important legacy – as important as football – that we lend the strength of Darrell's name to this incredible group of prominent Texans all of whom want to help in Darrell's honor to fund research that will not only cure this awful disease but bring the scientific spotlight to Texas."
